69-02: McIntosh v. Election Commissioner Keathley, 73-02 Nguyen v. Election Commissioner Maxwell, Election Commission Decisions #13 & #54/55. Election Code, Article IV, Section 3 & Article VI, Section 2

How the statue(s) is / are applicable

The Election Commission decisions #46, #47, #50 are inconsistent with the Court's opinion in 69-02. Election Commission Decisions #13 alongside #54/#55 show inconsistency in decision making. Court Opinion 73-02 shows a consistent pattern of handing down inconsistent rulings from this Commission

We request an investigation of decisions made by the Election Commission in order to prove their impartiality and consistency. Moreover, we request that decisions deemed inconsistent or at odds with the code or precedent be overturned.
