Harm

The Plaintiff has on this, and numerous other occasions, been denied the right to serve in Student Senate due to unfair prejudices and unethical behavior of the officers in question.

Jurisdiction

The Judicial Court of the Student Government Association has jurisdiction according the SGA Constitution Article IV Section III subsection (d) "Interpreting the Constitution and Branch By-Laws and Senate Legislation" as well as Article IV Section III subsection (g) "Ruling on any conflicts that arise concerning Student Government".

Background

- A. The Plaintiff has been denied or prohibited from serving in Student Senate by the same group no less than five times. Three of these times were against an empty seat.
- B. The exact same officers who testified against him before this court were the same ones making the decision.
- C. The Bylaws of Student Senate Article IX, SECTION II subsection (d) require the creation of a "standing committee" to review applications for an interview. This was not done.
- D. There are numerous discrepancies in the scoring system recorded by the Interviewers.
- E. The Plaintiff can prove through testimony and evidence that Officers in question have acted unprofessionally, and unethically and have abused the authority granted to them by the Student Senate.

Prayer

That the Student Government Association Judicial Court will act as an unbiased mediator to assess the validity of the Plaintiff's claims of discrimination and unethical behavior.
