SUMMARY

Plaintiff brought suit against the Election Commission on grounds of improper disqualification.

Decision

Part I. Disqualification

The Election Commission disqualified Senator Young according to election regulation Section II, F, 5 dealing with mandatory candidates meeting. Senator Young did not have a University Excused Absence as required per election commission rules. Senator Young claimed an extraordinary circumstance which precluded him from attending the meeting or finding a proxy to send in his stead. The Court looks to the merits of this claim and agrees that Senator Young's situation meets the definition of extraordinary circumstance. Therefore, the Court orders the Election Commission to place Senator Young's name on the ballot for the engineering caucus in a way that conforms with this ruling as well as meets the requirements as set forth by the Department of IT in regards to balloting timelines.
