Kyle Adams vs. Election Commission March 31, 2003, 9:00p.m.

In the case of Kyle Adams vs. Election Commission, the Court has unanimously decided to uphold the announced election results; therefore, the run-offs will proceed as scheduled. The Election Commission's interest in providing a fair and secure election is compelling enough to justify the possible, although unfortunate, side effects of impeding on some individuals' ability to vote online. Furthermore, any voter unable to vote online had the opportunity to vote at six on-campus polling stations.

The Judicial Court encourages the Election Commission to continue to work with Computing Information Systems (CIS) in order to improve the online voting system. Ongoing improvements in the system will aid students in voting online in future elections.
