
Charles Raimond, Jr. vs. Election Commission

In the case of Charles Raimond, Jr. vs. Election Commission, the Court has unanimously decided that a run-off election is in order based on the Run-Off Election provisions, page seven, number two, section A.


“If a tie for the first place occurs, only the candidates tied for first place shall run, with the winner having a majority vote of those voting for at least one candidate for that position.”


Due to the disqualification of Cedric Lear Bowling, the recipient of a majority of the votes cast, the three second place candidates, Plaintiff Charles Raimond Jr. included, are therefore eligible to participate in a run-off election as first place candidates.


If none of these candidates receive a majority in the run-off election, the position will be left vacant to be filled at a later time by the 2006 Class Council.




