Court: Hildebrand not to be disqualified

The Texas A&M Judicial Court unanimously voted Thesday to not disqualify Student Body President-elect Jack Hildebrand for improperly disclosing campaign finances and prorating unused materials, but said that changes need to be made by the Election Commission before next year's election.

Ionathan Platt, a senior political science major and member of Will McAdams' campaign team, said Hildebrand failed to disclose shipping and handling costs of stickers and wristbands purchased online from a Lubbock based company that were used in the campaign.

According to finance reports, Hildebrand purchased 1,000 whistbands for 22 cents apiece and 1,000 stickers for 6.89 cents apiece from Scarborough Specialties Inc. in Lubbock.

Only 750 of the wristbands and only 704 stickers were used. Platt said
